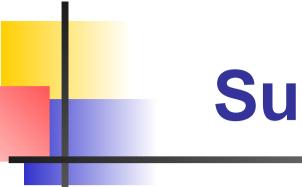

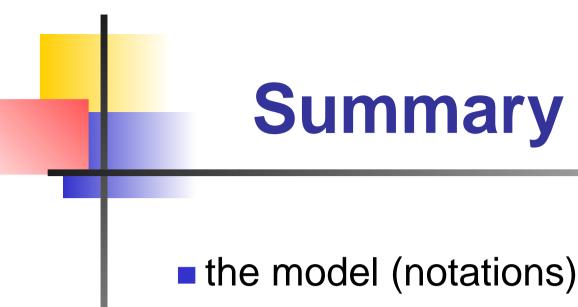

$$S = S_W[U] - \frac{\kappa}{2} \sum_{x,\mu} \left\{ \Phi^{\dagger}(x) U_{\mu}(x) \Phi(x+\hat{\mu}) + \Phi^{\dagger}(x+\hat{\mu}) U_{\mu}^{\dagger}(x) \Phi(x) \right\} + \lambda \sum_{x} [\Phi^{\dagger}(x) \Phi(x) - 1]^2$$

SU(2) gauge theory coupled with an Higgs in fundamental representation

$$S = S_W[U] - \frac{\kappa}{2} \sum_{x,\mu} \{ \Phi^{\dagger}(x) U_{\mu}(x) \Phi(x+\hat{\mu}) + \Phi^{\dagger}(x+\hat{\mu}) U_{\mu}^{\dagger}(x) \Phi(x) \} + \lambda \sum_{x} [\Phi^{\dagger}(x) \Phi(x) - 1]^2$$

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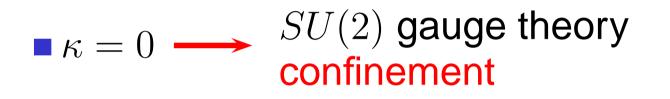

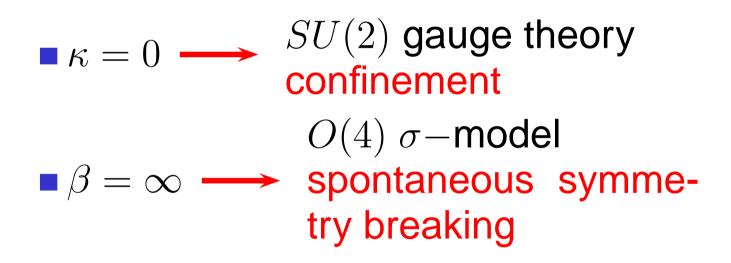

 $\kappa = 0 \longrightarrow \begin{array}{c} SU(2) \text{ gauge theory} \\ \text{confinement} \\ O(4) \ \sigma - \text{model} \\ \text{spontaneous symmetry breaking} \\ \beta = 0 & \begin{array}{c} \text{unitary} \\ \text{gauge} \end{array} \text{ indipendent } U_{\mu}(x)'s \end{array}$ 

#### **Features of the model** $S = S_W[U] - \frac{\kappa}{2} \sum_{n,\nu} \text{Tr}[\phi_x^{\dagger} U_{x,\mu} \phi_{x+\mu}]$

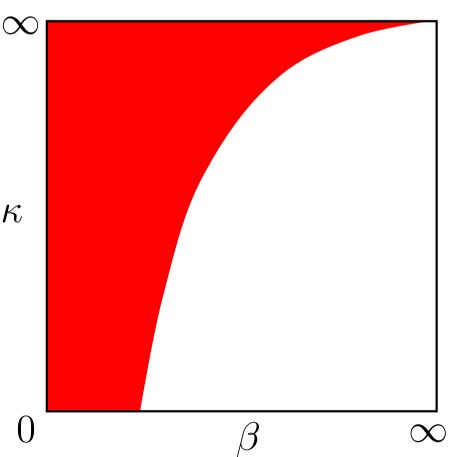
Limiting cases:

SU(2) gauge theory  $\mathbf{I} \kappa = 0$ confinement  $O(4) \sigma$ -model  $\beta = \infty \longrightarrow$  spontaneous symmetry breaking  $\beta = 0 \& \text{unitary} \longrightarrow \text{indipendent } U_{\mu}(x)'s$  $\kappa = \infty \& \text{unitary} \longrightarrow \text{gauge}$ no dynamics

#### Fradkin-Shenker theorem:

in the red region local observables are analytic  $\kappa$ 

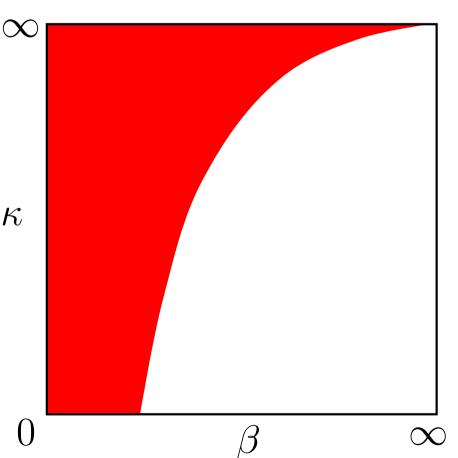


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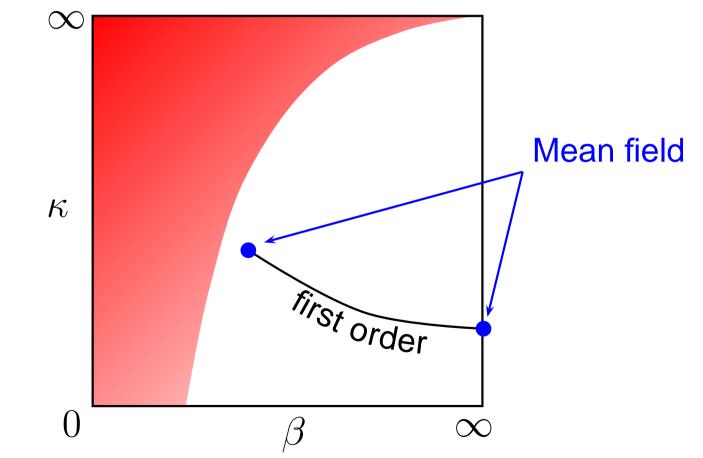
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The theorem does not hold for *non-local* observables! Grady, Phys. Lett. B 626, 161 (2005)



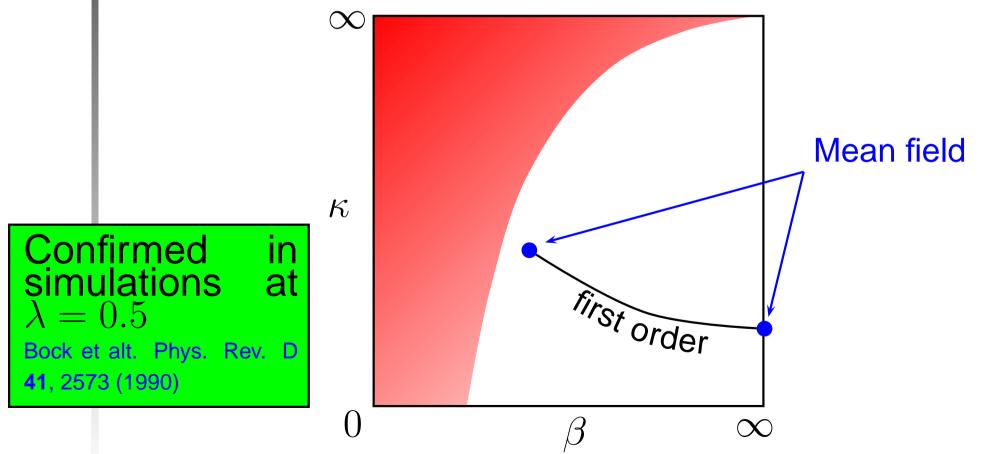

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## Results in literature for the $\lambda = \infty$ case

first numerical study on 4<sup>4</sup> lattice seems to confirm theoretical prediction

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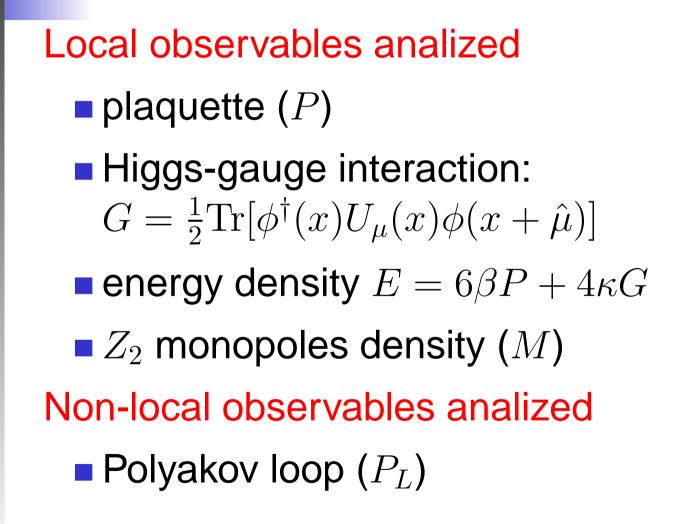
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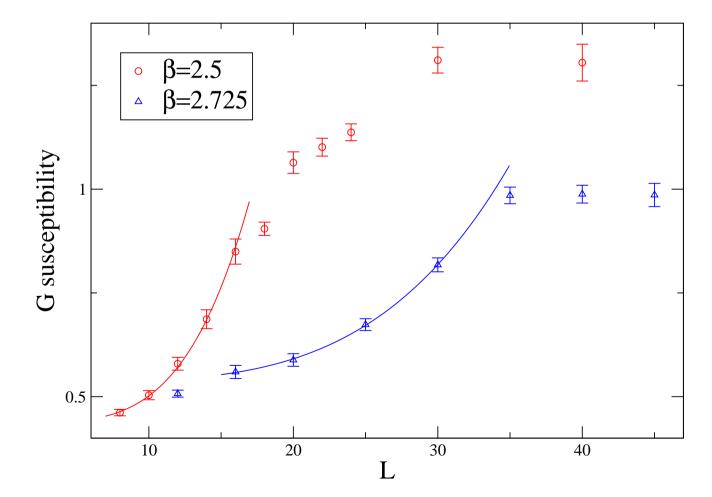
• "the system exhibits a transient behavior up to L = 24 along which the order of the transition cannot be discerned" (also in this case  $\beta = 2.3$ )

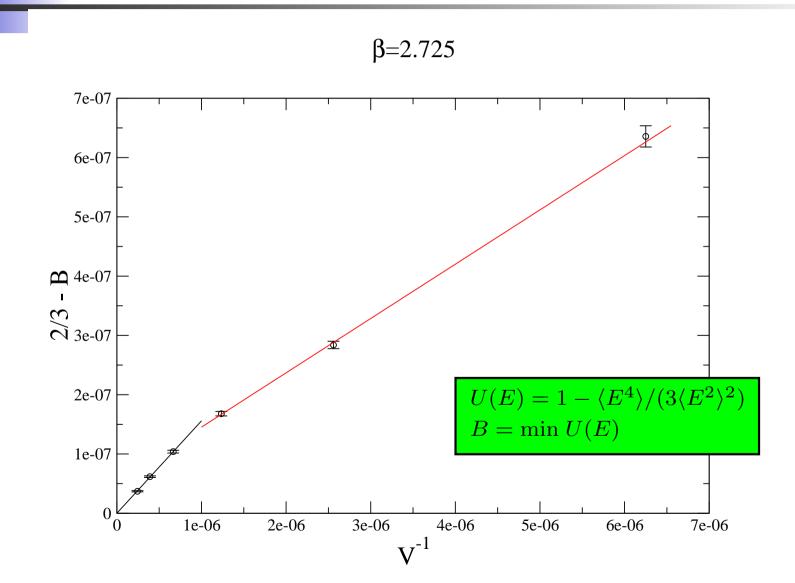

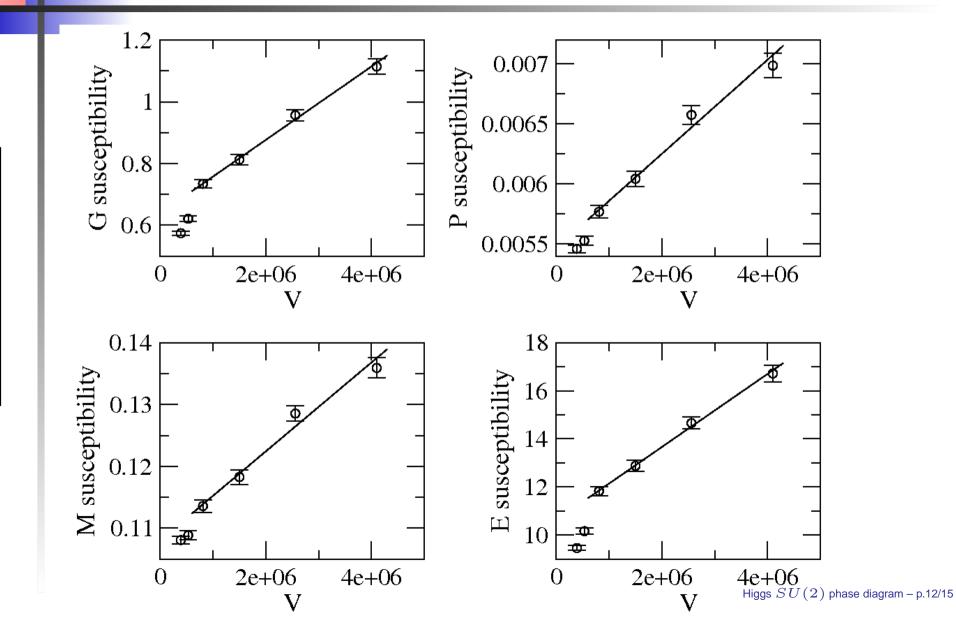


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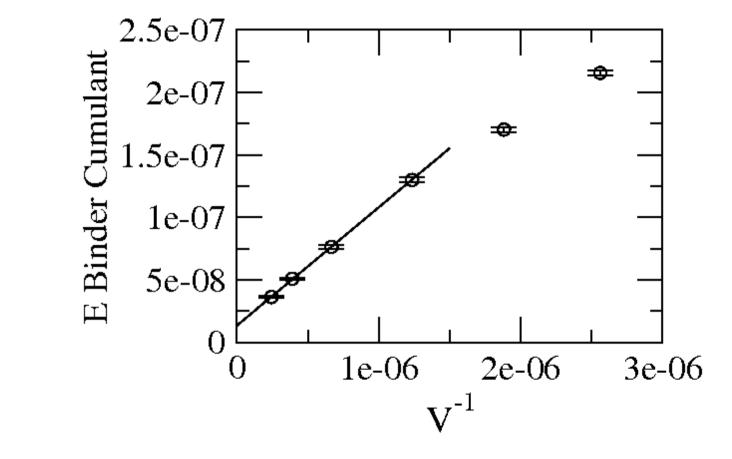


Higgs SU(2) phase diagram – p.11/15

### Results for "big $\beta$ " and T = 0 ( $\beta = 2.775$ )

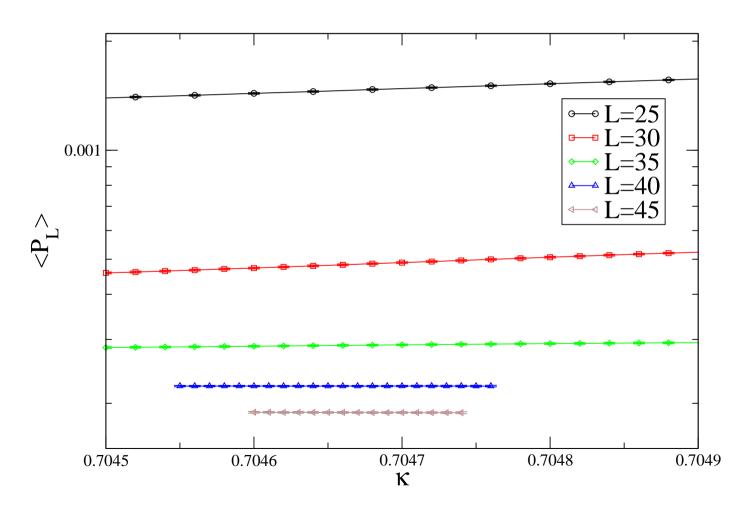


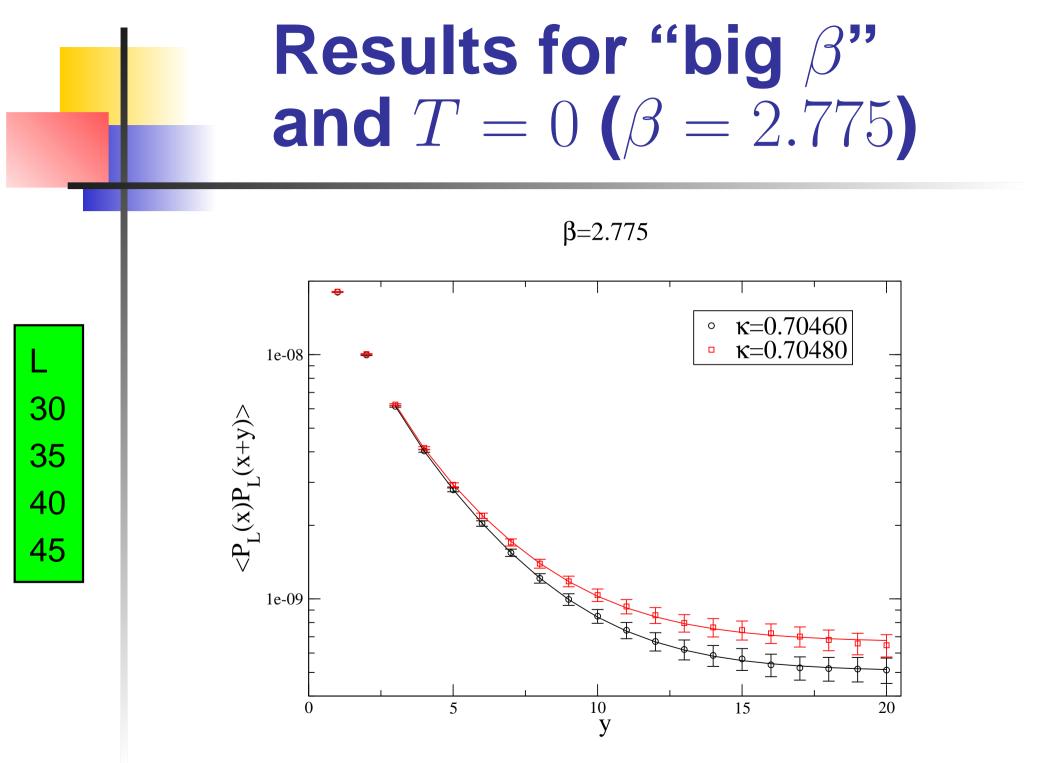
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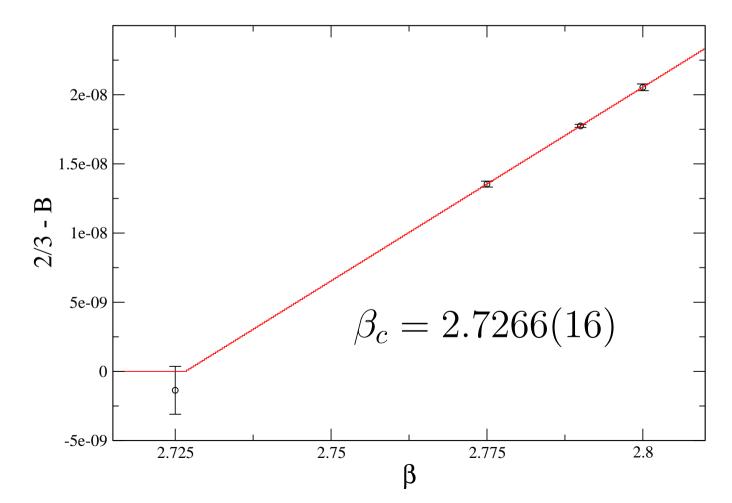

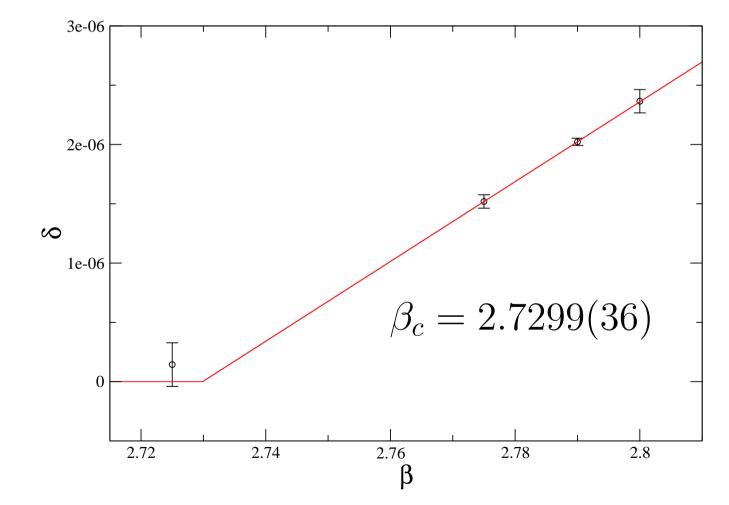
#### First method $E_{\pm} = \lim_{\beta \to \beta_c^{\pm}} \langle E \rangle$ $\Delta = E_+ - E_- \qquad \epsilon = \frac{1}{2}(E_+ + E_-)$ $\lim_{L \to \infty} B(E) = \frac{2}{3} - \frac{1}{3} \left(\frac{\Delta}{\epsilon}\right)^2 + o(\Delta^2)$ for a mean field critical point $\Delta \propto t^{1/2}$

$$\lim_{L\to\infty} B(E) \approx \frac{2}{3} - \gamma_1(\beta - \beta_c)$$



 $\begin{array}{l} \mbox{Second method} \\ \chi(O) = V(\langle O^2 \rangle - \langle O \rangle^2) \propto V \Delta^2 \\ \mbox{for a mean field critical point } \Delta \propto t^{1/2} \end{array}$ 

fitting 
$$\chi = \gamma_2 + V\delta$$
  
 $\delta \approx \gamma_3(\beta - \beta_c)$ 



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the problem of the interpretation of the phase transition as a deconfinement one is raised
