### Precision LATTICE QCD

Unquenched calculations with relatively low quark masses are now being performed by several groups using different approaches (lattice action, renormalization,...). Crucial when aiming at a percent precision.

#### "PRECISION" LATTICE QCD: WHY NOW

### 1) Increasing of computational power Unquenched simulations



For Lattice QCD collab.ns today: ~ 1-20 TFlops

TeraFlops machines are required to perform unquenched simulations

CPU cost for Nf=2 Wilson fermions: [Del Debbio et al. 2006] TFlops-years  $\approx 0.15 \left(\frac{N_{conf}}{100}\right) \left(\frac{L_s}{3 \text{ fm}}\right)^5 \left(\frac{L_t}{2L_s}\right) \left(\frac{0.15}{\hat{m}/m_s}\right) \left(\frac{0.08 \text{ fm}}{a}\right)^6$

The PDG 2004 quoted a  $2\sigma$  deviation from unitarity:

# $fk/f\pi$ from LATTICE QCD

- Old quenched calculations typically indicated
  - $f_{\rm K}/f_{\pi}\text{-}1{\simeq}0.15,~25\%$  smaller than the exper. value
- Similar results were obtained by the first unquenched calculations

- A common feature of these calculations:  $M_{\pi} \gtrsim 500 \text{ MeV}$

# Vus from KI3 decays

$$\Gamma_{K \to \pi l \nu} = C_K^2 \frac{G_F^2 m_K^5}{192\pi^2} I S_{\text{EW}} [1 + \Delta_{SU(2)} + 2\Delta_{\text{EM}}] \times [V_{us}|^2 |f_+^{K\pi}(0)|^2]$$

Ademollo-Gatto:  $f_{+}(0) = 1 - O(m_s - m_u)^2 \iff O(1\%)$ . But represents the largest theoret. uncertainty



### Analytical calculations of $f_4$ are model dependent

$$f_4 = \Delta_{\text{loops}}(\mu) - \frac{8}{F_{\pi}^4} [C_{12}(\mu) + C_{34}(\mu)] (M_K^2 - M_{\pi}^2)^2$$

### The pion electromagnetic form factor

An important test for Lattice QCD calculations of KI3 form factors: precise experimental data, no CKM factor



#### Advanced techniques:

- All-to-all stochastic propagators  $\rightarrow$  very good statistical accuracy
- Twisted boundary cond.  $\rightarrow$  continuously varying lattice momenta:  $\vec{p} = \vec{\theta} + \frac{2\pi}{2}$

# f<sub>+</sub>(0): LATTICE SUMMARY





- Analytical (model dependent) results slightly higher than Lattice QCD

lattice calculations (Nf=0,2,
2+1)

# LATTICE QCD AND THE UNITARITY TRIANGLE ANALYSIS

### 15 years of Unitarity Triangle Analysis



Lattice results are available since many years Remarkable predictions of (quenched) lattice QCD:

Ciuchini et al., 1995: Sin $2\beta_{\text{UTA}} = 0.65 \pm 0.12$ 

Direct measurement: Sin2 $\beta_{J/\psi K0}$  = 0.668 ± 0.026 Ciuchini et al.,2000:  $\Delta m_s = (16.3 \pm 3.4) \text{ ps}^{-1}$ 

Direct measurement:  $\Delta m_s = (17.77 \pm 0.12) \text{ ps}^{-1}$

f<sub>Bs</sub>= 245 ± 25 MeV

 $f_B = 200 \pm 20 \text{ MeV}$  $f_{Bs}/f_B = 1.21 \pm 0.04$  Only 2 recent calculations (with staggered fermions and the b-quark with FNAL or NRQCD)



# B-B mixing: B<sub>Bd</sub> and B<sub>Bs</sub>



-Small SU(3) breaking effects: B<sub>Bd</sub> ≈ B<sub>Bs</sub>

-Small quenching effects: consistent Nf=0, Nf=2 and Nf=2+1 results

### UT FIT OF LATTICE PARAMETERS



Very good agreement: a success for the SM Lattice QCD is almost "irrelevant" for the SM analysis

### NEW PHYSICS: THE MODEL DEPENDENT

New Physics effects are described by the low-energy effective Hamiltonian

$$\left\langle M | H_{\text{eff}}^{\text{NP}} | \bar{M} \right\rangle = \sum_{i} C_{i}(\mu) \left\langle M | Q_{i}(\mu) | \bar{M} \right\rangle$$
NEW PHYSICS SCALE LATTICE QCD

### ...AND MODEL INDEPENDENT ANALYSIS

New Physics in  $\Delta F = 2$  amplitudes is parameterized in a general form

$$\mathbf{C}_{\mathbf{B}_{d}} e^{2i\boldsymbol{\varphi}_{\mathbf{B}_{d}}} = \frac{\left\langle B_{d}^{0} \mid \boldsymbol{H}_{\mathrm{eff}}^{\mathrm{full}} \mid \boldsymbol{\overline{B}}_{d}^{0} \right\rangle}{\left\langle B_{d}^{0} \mid \boldsymbol{H}_{\mathrm{eff}}^{\mathrm{SM}} \mid \boldsymbol{\overline{B}}_{d}^{0} \right\rangle}$$

6 additional free parameters  $C_{Bd}$ ,  $\phi_{Bd}$ ,  $C_{Bs}$ ,  $\phi_{Bs}$ ,  $C_{\epsilon K}$ ,  $C_{\Delta m K}$ 

E.g.:  $(\Delta m_d)^{exp} = C_{Bd} (\Delta m_d)^{SM}$ ,  $sin 2\beta^{exp} = sin 2(\beta^{SM} + \varphi_{Bd})$ 

In the Standard Model:  $C_{xx} = 1$ ,  $\phi_{xx} = 0$ 

### MATRIX ELEMENTS FOR K-K AN B-B MIXING BEYOND THE STANDARD MODEL



The full operator basis only in the quenched approximation For K-Kbar mixing results quite in disagreement

### THE MODEL INDEPENDENT ANALYSIS





The p.d.f. is asymmetric: φ<sub>Bs</sub> = (-16.6 + 5.8 – 9.3)° U ...

#### THE STANDARD MODEL IS AT ~2.9 SIGMA
